
NORTHEAST SUMMER BUCKET LIST

Soar to Vermont's Highest Peak


Of all the lovely mountain peaks in the Green Mountain State, the highest is Mount Mansfield at 4,395 feet. In the summer (and fall and winter, for that matter) Stowe's iconic red Gondola cabins whisk you to the summit. Once there, the adventure is just getting started! Enjoy winding trails along the ridgelines and summit as you seek out all the vistas and views. After working up an appetite, enjoy quick service refreshments at the Waffle or stay a while and dine at the Cliff House, where you'll find breathtaking panoramic mountain views.

Hike to great heights at Wildcat!

Passionate hikers looking to add to their bucket list of 4,000-foot peaks climbed (often called peak-baggers for their intrepid pursuit of high climbs in the Northeast) are drawn to some of the highest mountain peaks in the Northeast in New Hampshire, including the most prominent mountain east of the Mississippi River: Mount Washington at 6,288 feet. In north-central New Hampshire, the White Mountain National Forrest has several 4,000-plus-footers and two especially popular with bucket-list climbers: Wildcat A at 4,422 feet and Wildcat D at 4,062. The Wildcat ridgeline is made up of five "sub-peaks" rising more than 4,000 feet, but the mountain's A and D peaks are popular climbing routes and offer incredible views of Mount Washington and its Tuckerman and Huntington ravines.

Ride Timber Ripper Mountain Coaster

Just as the name implies, the Timber Ripper Mountain Coaster is a definite Bucket List experience at this family resort in the central Vermont hamlet of Ludlow. This attraction is super-unique—make that Super-Unique with a capital S and U. Guests load and unload the Timber Ripper in the Jackson Gore base area, near the bottom of the Coleman Brook Express lift. The ride begins with a 1,600-foot climb before a 375 vertical-foot drop along 3,100 feet of track complete with banking loops and a "twister" section, at speeds of up to 25 mph! The coaster runs all year, offering an exhilarating experience no matter the season. Other Adventure Zone attractions include a climbing wall, mini-golf, bounce house and more. After your day of outdoor fun, relax with an ice-cold refreshment and meal at the Coleman Brook Tavern, boasting a special summertime menu.

Send it at Sunapee Bike Park

Live free and ride? If you're a mountain biker, that's an apt-variation on New Hampshire's state motto "live free or die." In summer, single-track riding and lift hauls rule at Sunapee in Newbury, N.H. And if you purchase the Vail Northeast Three Mountain Bike Pass, you can fill out your mountain-biking bucket list at Mount Sunapee and take advantage of unlimited access to the nearby bike parks at Mount Snow and Okemo in Vermont. At Mount Sunapee, the pass includes access to disc golf, the Archery Course, and unlimited scenic summer chairlift rides.

Hike Crotched Mountain

Although Crotched Mountain does not have summer operations, hiking Crotched is a must-do in the summer for any mountain lover in the Northeast. You'll find a range of hikes at Crotched in the Granite State's Manadnock Region and the mountain ledges give you breathtaking views of the area's mountain peaks and stellar summer sunsets.

Play a Round at Mount Snow Golf Club

The Mount Snow Golf Club is 18-holes of challenging fun on Country Club Drive just a few minutes from the main resort and the Grand Summit Hotel, which has a full-service spa, heated outdoor pool and hot tubs, fitness center and restaurants. But those amenities are for après-golf—first you want to reserve a tee-time and hit the links on the course that Golf Digest magazine rates in the top five in Vermont. The first hole faces Mount Snow (you'll note the ski trails) and the views persist as you travel the course, which is truly a mountain course at 2,000 feet above sea level. Take advantage of Epic Mountain Rewards discounts on golf, retail items and meals at Fairways Restaurant at the club. Fairways offers lives music on Saturdays into October.

Scenic Lift Ride to New York's Highest Fire Tower

About 2.5hrs from the wildness of downtown Manhattan you'll discover peace and tranquility in the true wilderness in the Catskill Mountains surrounding Hunter Mountain – Metro New York's true gem for four-season fun. The six-seater Kaatskill Flyer chairlift takes you to the 3,200-foot summit of Hunter Mountain and on a clear day you can salute the Berkshires of Massachusetts, other area Catskill peaks and the Green Mountains to the north. From there, walk the 2-mile hiking trail to the Empire State's tallest Fire Tower standing at 4,040 feet for epic 360-degree views.
